Connecting point...

How can I focus on my blessings rather than my struggles?

It's easy to say, "I'm blessed." We say it when things are going well when life feels stable, our needs are met, and we're surrounded by people we

love. But do you ever stop and think about how blessed you really are? Do you recognize how quickly life can change?

In this Sunday's Gospel, Jesus gives us the Beatitudes, but He also issues a warning—the "woes." These aren't meant to be negative statements but, rather, wake -up calls. When Jesus says, "Woe to you," He is really saying, "Watch out!" He's reminding us that the things we may take for granted, like wealth, comfort, or popularity, can disappear in an instant.

If you base your sense of blessing only on what you have, what happens when those things are gone? In addition, focusing only on your struggles risks missing the bigger picture—God's presence and the deeper blessings that don't fade away.

¿Cómo puedo centrarme en mis bendiciones en lugar de en mis luchas?

Es fácil decir: "Soy afortunado". Lo decimos cuando las cosas van bien, cuando la vida parece estable, nuestras necesidades están satisfechas y estamos rodeados de personas que amamos. Pero ¿alguna vez te detienes a pensar en lo afortunado que eres realmente? ¿Reconoces lo rápido que puede cambiar la vida? En el Evangelio de este domingo, Jesús nos da las Bienaventuranzas, pero también nos hace una advertencia: los "ayes". No se trata de afirmaciones negativas, sino de llamadas de atención. Cuando Jesús dice "¡Ay de vosotros!", en realidad está diciendo "¡Tened cuidado!". Nos recuerda que las cosas que damos por sentadas, como la riqueza, la comodidad o la popularidad, pueden desaparecer en un instante.

Si basas tu sentido de bendición únicamente en lo que tienes, ¿qué sucede cuando esas cosas desaparecen? Además, si te concentras únicamente en tus luchas corres el riesgo de perder de vista el panorama más amplio: la presencia de Dios

The Beatitudes challenge us to see blessings differently. Blessed are the poor, the hungry, the weeping—not because suffering is good, but because God is present in it. Being truly blessed isn't about having a perfect life; it's about knowing that God is constant, no matter what happens. He is our source of joy, peace, and strength, even when life gets hard.

So, how can you focus on your blessings instead of your struggles? Maybe it's by shifting your perspective to see what you have—not what you lack. Perhaps it's by finding gratitude, even in the challenges. Still, maybe it's by remembering that no matter what changes, God never does.

This week, take a moment to pause, notice the blessings in your life, and trust that God is walking with you in everything.

Él es nuestra fuente de alegría, paz y fortaleza, incluso cuando la vida se pone difícil. Entonces, ¿cómo puedes concentrarte en tus bendiciones en lugar de en tus luchas? We are a growing service organization who are willing to make a difference in today's society.


We operate as a unified body of Catholic women who assist the Armada K of C, Council 7561, however you don't need to be a spouse of a K. of C. to join.

GOSPEL MEDITATION - February 16, 2025 6th Sunday of Ordinary Time Luke 6:17, 20-26

I craved four things as a teenager: success in sports, food, fun and the attention of popular people. However, I noticed that as I acquired them, I was more unsatisfied than before. So, I'd strive even more energetically, achieve

more, and the sense of emptiness was greater still. These four things started to feel like burdens or even curses. Soon after, I encountered Christ in my high school youth group. Experiencing his love was totally different than anything those four things previously produced. It produced a lasting happiness.

Jesus utters a kind of four-fold curse in this week's Gospel of Saint Luke's "woes": "Woe to you who are rich...who are filled now...who laugh now...who are well-spoken of" (cf. Luke 6:24-26). How marvelous that these correspond perfectly to the four things that obsessed my teenage soul: riches, food, laughter and good reputation. The "woes" the Lord speaks are warnings: when those things are the *purpose* of your life, you'll be miserable. He is saying, "You'll be happy, or blessed, in the measure that these things do not determine the shape of our lives, and the kingdom of God does."

To some degree, we're all spiritual teenagers, addicted to one or more of those four "woes." How splendid that the Lord wants his to bless us — that is, to satisfy us, make us laugh with joy, and in the kingdom of God, offer us what will truly satisfy us. But first let's admit what is causing our "woes."


