Connecting point...

Whose voice do I trust?

Simon Peter's act of trust in Jesus, despite his doubts, teaches us an important lesson about which voices we choose to acknowledge in our own lives. In Luke's Gospel this weekend, Simon had every reason to doubt

Jesus' instruction to lower the nets again. He was an experienced fisherman who had already tried and failed all night. He was likely exhausted and discouraged. Yet, instead of listening to the voice of doubt that said, "You're not good enough," or the voice of despair that whispered, "Just give up," he chose to listen to the voice of Jesus. His willingness to obey led to an overwhelming, miraculous catch—more than he ever imagined possible.

Like Simon, we are surrounded by many voices every day. Some voices—those that try to pull us away from God's path—discourage us, saying, "It's too late to change" or "Everyone else is doing it." These voices can be loud and convincing, especially when we feel weary, unworthy, or trapped by past mistakes. However, Jesus calls us to trust Him, even when His direction seems difficult or when we feel unqualified. He speaks to our hearts, telling us, "You've got this," "I have a plan for you," and "You're stronger than you think." His voice reminds us that we are not alone—that He is leading us toward something greater.

Punto de conexión...

¿En qué voz confió?

El acto de confianza de Simón Pedro en Jesús, a pesar de sus dudas, nos enseña una lección importante sobre qué voces elegimos reconocer en nuestras propias vidas. En el Evangelio de Lucas de este fin de semana, Simón tenía todas las razones para dudar de la instrucción de Jesús de volver a echar las redes. Era un pescador experimentado que ya lo había intentado y fracasado toda la noche. Probablemente estaba exhausto y desanimado. Sin embargo, en lugar de escuchar la voz de la duda que le decía: "No eres lo suficientemente bueno", o la voz de la desesperación que le susurraba: "Ríndete", eligió escuchar la voz de Jesús. Su voluntad de obedecer lo llevó a una pesca abrumadora y milagrosa, más de lo que jamás imaginó posible.

Al igual que Simón, estamos rodeados de muchas voces todos los días. Algunas voces —las que intentan apartarnos del camino de Dios— nos desaniman, diciendo: "Es demasiado tarde para cambiar" o "Todos los demás lo están haciendo".

In the first reading, the prophet Isaiah also faced a moment of doubt. He encountered the glory of God and felt unworthy, saying, "Woe is me! I am a man of unclean lips." But the voice of the Lord called him beyond his fear, cleansing and strengthening him for his mission. Isaiah did not hesitate when God asked, "Whom shall I send?" Instead, he answered, "Here I am. Send me!" Like Simon, Isaiah had to silence the voices of inadequacy and fear to respond to God's call.

Jesus calls each of us to trust Him, even when we feel weak or uncertain. The world's voices may try to convince us otherwise, but His voice is the one that leads to life, hope, and abundance. May we learn to recognize and trust the voice of Jesus in our hearts, knowing that He will never lead us astray.

Estas voces pueden ser fuertes y convincentes, especialmente cuando nos sentimos cansados, indignos o atrapados por errores pasados. Sin embargo, Jesús nos llama a confiar en Él, incluso cuando su dirección parece difícil o cuando nos sentimos incapaces de hacerlo. Él habla a nuestro corazón y nos dice: "Tú puedes con esto", "Tengo un plan para tí" y "Eres más fuerte de lo que crees". Su voz nos recuerda que no estamos solos, que Él nos está guiando hacia algo más grande.

En la primera lectura, el profeta Isaías también afrontó un momento de duda. Se encontró con la gloria de Dios y se sintió indigno, diciendo: "¡Ay de mí! Soy un hombre de labios impuros". Pero la voz del Señor lo llamó más allá de su miedo, purificándolo y fortaleciéndolo para su misión. Isaías no dudó cuando Dios le preguntó: "¿A quién enviaré?" En cambio, respondió: "Aquí estoy. ¡Envíame a mí!". Como Simón, Isaías tuvo que silenciar las voces de incompetencia y miedo para responder al llamado de Dios.

Jesús nos llama a cada uno de nosotros a confiar en Él, incluso cuando nos sentimos débiles o inseguros. Las voces del mundo pueden tratar de convencernos de lo contrario, pero Su voz es la que conduce a la vida, la esperanza y la abundancia. Aprendamos a reconocer y confiar en la voz de Jesús en nuestros corazones, sabiendo que Él nunca nos llevará por mal camino.

February 9, 2025 - 5th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Luke 5:1-11

My parents' garage is full of old junk that no longer serves any purpose in my life. As a 46-year-old man, I admit that's pretty lame. Either due to my sentimentality or laziness (or both, probably), I just couldn't get myself to throw things away. But a few days ago, by a grace of God, I thought: "I'll hire my nephew Ryan to throw a bunch of my stuff away — he couldn't care less about my junk!" And you know what? It worked. In one day, Ryan chucked the majority of his uncle's useless stuff. I feel so free, ready for a new junk-free chapter in my life.

This kind of thing happens in this Sunday's Gospel. Peter's net is full of useless junk. Luke says he and the others are cleaning their nets after catching no fish. Imagine them dejectedly and impatiently removing a nasty assortment of seaweed, sticks and muck. The Lord teaches and calls them once their nets are cleared out. So it goes with us. Spiritual life begins by removing that which is useless and merely taking up space in our hearts, minds and lives. Then Jesus teaches and acts in a marvelous way in our lives, too.

So what's junking up your net? What habits, attachments, possessions, preoccupations? If, like me, you struggle to clean your nets by yourself, ask the Lord to send you someone like my nephew to be your "Peter" and help you clean it out. It is well worth it. Once Peter's net is clean, he is free to make a wonderful catch.

MEDITACIÓN DEL EVANGELIO – ALENTAR UN ENTENDIMIENTO MÁS PROFUNDO DE LA ESCRITURA

9 de febrero de 2025

5º Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario

¿Cuántas veces en la jornada laboral nos hemos decepcionado, trabajamos mucho, nos cansamos y pareciera que no avanzamos nada? Qué decepción nos embarga cuando esto pasa, nos lamentamos diciendo, lástima de cansancio.

Y, a empezar de nuevo. Algo parecido le pasó a Pedro en su jornada laboral, había sido inútil el esfuerzo. De tal forma que, cuando Jesús le dice que navegue de nuevo mar adentro, Pedro le dice: *"hemos trabajado toda la noche y ha sido en vano. No hemos pescado nada. Pero, confiando en ti, lo haré"*. Y se obtuvo el resultado de la pesca milagrosa. *"Y pescaron tal cantidad de peces, que las redes se rompían"* (Lucas 5:6).

La respuesta de Pedro fue impetuosa y se arrodilló ante Jesús: *"Señor, apártate de mí, que soy un pecador. Dios siempre se adelanta, y siempre nos espera. Jesús es el Señor, es la manifestación de Dios, y por ello Simón Pedro piensa que debe de haber una distancia entre el pecador y el Santo. Y es por su condición de pecador por lo que Jesús no se aleja de él. Si eres pecador, el Señor te espera aún más"* (Papa Francisco). ¿Por qué será que la bondad y la misericordia de Dios nos asustan? Pedro, en lugar de correr y abrazar a Jesús y darle las gracias, le dice; *"Señor, apártate de mí, que soy un hombre pecador"* (Lucas 5:8). Sin embargo, la respuesta de Jesús es atrayente: *"No temas; en adelante serás pescador de hombres"* (Lucas 5:10). ¡Señor, quédate en mí, aunque soy pecador!
