Connecting point...

How can I be God's loving embrace to someone this week?

As we celebrate the Fourth Sunday of Lent, we hear the Parable of the Prodigal Son—a story about the relationship between a father and his two sons, which may be as complicated as many of our own family situations. I recommend reading Henri Nouwen's *The Return of the Prodigal Son*, a book about the dangers of being self-righteous and unforgiving, as well as the importance of understanding God's truly unconditional love and forgiveness.

While preparing for this reflection, I found myself drawn to the opening passage of today's Gospel: "The tax collectors and sinners were all drawing near to listen to Jesus, but the Pharisees and scribes began to complain, saying, 'This man welcomes sinners and eats with them'" (Luke 15:1-3). Reflect on that simple sentence and see where you fit. Are you a tax collector? Tax collectors were

Punto de conexión...

¿Cómo puedo ser el abrazo amoroso de Dios para alguien esta semana?

Al celebrar el Cuarto Domingo de Cuaresma, escuchamos la Parábola del Hijo Pródigo: una historia sobre la relación entre un padre y sus dos hijos, que puede ser tan compleja como muchas de nuestras propias situaciones familiares. Recomiendo leer *El Regreso del Hijo Pródigo* de Henri Nouwen, un libro sobre los peligros de la autocomplacencia y la falta de perdón, así como sobre la importancia de comprender el amor y el perdón verdaderamente incondicionales de Dios.

Mientras me preparaba para esta reflexión, me sentí atraído por el primer pasaje del Evangelio de hoy: «Los publicanos y los pecadores se acercaban para escuchar a Jesús, pero los fariseos y los escribas comenzaron a murmurar, diciendo: "Este recibe a los pecadores y come con ellos"» (Lucas 15:1-3). Reflexiona sobre esa simple frase y ve dónde encajas. ¿Eres un

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known to be dishonest. Are you a sinner? It is hard to admit, but we are all sinners. Are you a Pharisee or scribe? Though well-educated in their faith, Jesus often labeled them as hypocrites because of their love for power and honor. They did not understand the importance of serving others with justice and mercy.

In my own life, I can unfortunately see myself in all three groups. Finding myself being dishonest (like tax collectors and sinners) bothers me a great deal, but it troubles me even more that I can also see myself as a Pharisee and scribe. I'm a fairly active and educated person in my faith; I go to Mass, partake in the Eucharist, go to Reconciliation, attend Adoration, and pray daily...but these are some of the same actions that the Pharisees and scribes found important. And while they are important, I realized there are many ways I fall behind in what Jesus finds important—serving others with justice and mercy.

So, how can I be God's loving embrace to someone this week? Personally, I will work on my ability to forgive others, keep my sense of entitlement in check, and focus more on showing mercy than casting judgment. To start, I am going to become more aware of the role of the Corporal Works of Mercy in my daily life (i.e., feed the hungry, give drink to the thirsty, shelter the homeless, clothe the naked, visit the sick, visit the prisoner, bury the dead, and give alms to the poor).

To raise my awareness, I have to start thinking differently. When I see someone in need, I must focus on helping them instead of judging them for their situation. I also have to remember that "visiting the prisoner" does not only include those who are incarcerated; people struggling with addiction also live their lives in a different type of prison. In addition, "visiting the sick" can mean the simple act of donating blood, visiting an elderly neighbor, or calling a friend who is struggling.

If I open my mind and heart to what Jesus asks of me, the things I can do are endless. I hope you take on the challenge of showing someone God's loving embrace this week.

May our Lenten journeys allow us to slow down and pay attention to God's role in our lives. Remember, God is always there; we are the ones who have trouble listening.

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recaudador de impuestos? Los recaudadores de impuestos eran conocidos por su deshonestidad. ¿Eres un pecador? Es difícil admitirlo, pero todos somos pecadores. ¿Eres un fariseo o un escriba? Aunque bien educados en su fe, Jesús a menudo los tildaba de hipócritas por su amor al poder y al honor. No entendían la importancia de servir a los demás con justicia y misericordia.

En mi propia vida, lamentablemente me veo en los tres grupos. Descubrir que soy deshonesto (como los recaudadores de impuestos y los pecadores) me molesta mucho, pero me preocupa aún más verme también como fariseo y escriba. Soy una persona bastante activa y culta en mi fe; voy a misa, participo en la Eucaristía, voy a la Reconciliación, asisto a la Adoración y rezo a diario... pero estas son algunas de las mismas acciones que los fariseos y escribas consideraban importantes. Y aunque son importantes, me di cuenta de que hay muchas maneras en que me quedo atrás en lo que Jesús considera importante: servir a los demás con justicia y misericordia.

Entonces, ¿cómo puedo ser el abrazo amoroso de Dios para alguien esta semana? Personalmente, trabajaré en mi capacidad de perdonar a los demás, controlar mi sentido de derecho y enfocarme más en mostrar misericordia que en juzgar. Para empezar, voy a ser más consciente del papel de las Obras Corporales de Misericordia en mi vida diaria (es decir, alimentar al hambriento, dar de beber al sediento, dar techo al desamparado, vestir al desnudo, visitar al enfermo, visitar al preso, enterar a los muertos y dar limosna a los pobres).

Para concientizarme, debo empezar a pensar de otra manera. Cuando veo a alguien necesitado, debo enfocarme en ayudarlo en lugar de juzgarlo por su situación. También debo recordar que "visitar al preso" no solo incluye a quienes están encarcelados; las personas con adicciones también viven en una prisión diferente. Además, "visitar a los enfermos" puede significar el simple acto de donar sangre, visitar a un vecino mayor o llamar a un amigo que esté pasando por un momento difícil.

Si abro mi mente y mi corazón a lo que Jesús me pide, las cosas que puedo hacer son infinitas. Espero que aceptes el reto de mostrarle a alguien el abrazo amoroso de Dios esta semana.

Que nuestros caminos cuaresmales nos permitan detenernos y prestar atención al papel de Dios en nuestras vidas. Recuerda, Dios siempre está ahí; somos nosotros los que tenemos dificultad para escuchar.

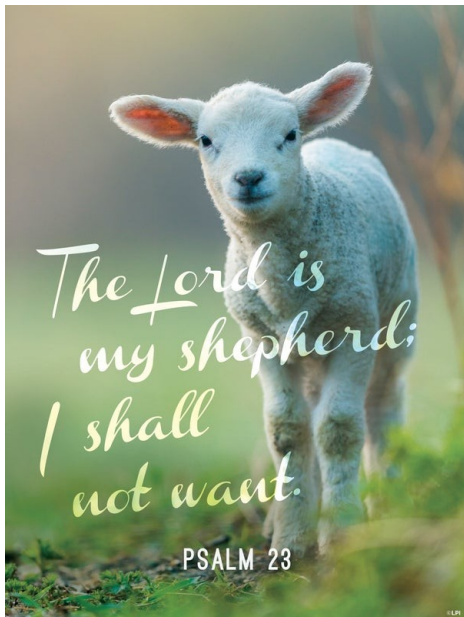

Saving the Unborn

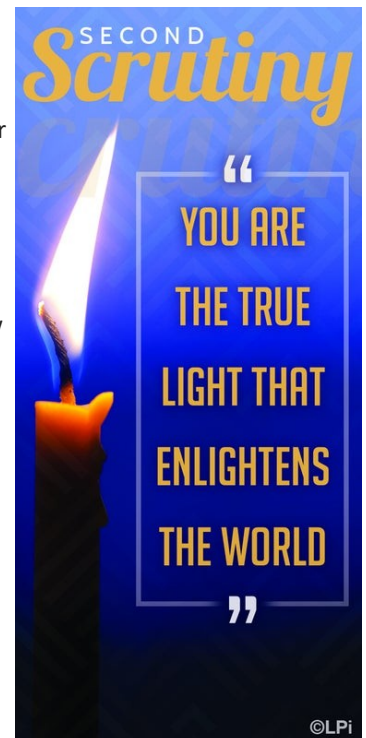

Second Scrutiny

We cannot travel into the darkness without a source of light. Those going through the Second Scrutiny have come seeking light instead of darkness. When Jesus heals the blind man, he not only gives to him a physical sight that is real, but he also provides for him a new spiritual lens through which he can see the world. Those who witness the healing, those who then encounter the man, and even those who maintain a cynicism toward him, all have been offered this new way of seeing the world. Those of us who have been baptized have this gift of new sight, but too often we either choose to put on glasses of sin or despair or act like we cannot see that which exists clearly in front of us. We pray for those who will be baptized at Easter to be freed from their darkness, while we oftentimes choose to live with our eyes closed. As we listen to the words of Jesus in the Gospel proclaiming he is the Light of the World, let us resolve to allow God to provide a light for our path so that we may share the good news of this Light with all around us.
